We can find nothing in our Archives as to why the “Scotch” Church in Cornwall chose the name “St. John’s”. It is pretty obvious however, that it was chosen at first to distinguish it from the “English” (or Anglican) Church already in town. In liturgical art the eagle became affixed to the Gospel of St. John because very early it was acknowledged that this Gospel “soars above the others in its presentation of Jesus Christ. Perhaps in its worship style, and preaching, Cornwall’s first Presbyterians sought to do also!
