Advent is a time of looking inward and outward at the same time. It could hardly be otherwise for Advent is the Season of Preparation.

John the Baptist appears with his message of repentance. He came to prepare the way in anticipation of a new thing that God was about to do.

John was firmly rooted in the community of the people of God. Behind him is all that action of God over history in calling out a people and giving them a mission. God is working out a purpose. John brings great expectancy and hope. He gets the people on their tiptoes, eagerly looking forward to what God is doing in the world and in their lives. *The kingdom of heaven is upon you*.
