#### (Light the candle of peace)


L: People of peace, God desires people who hold fast to the vision of God's Kingdom where peace and justice reign.

# Finding Peace in the Kindness of Others

Junayet Ahammed will never forget the day he watched his family's house burn to the ground.

It was the day the military attacked his village in Myanmar.

Since August 2017, innocent Rohingya children, families and communities in Myanmar's Rakhine state have been subject to escalating violence—torture and killings — because of their ethnicity and religion.

Over 700,000 Rohingya people, including Junayet's family, have fled to refugee camps just over the border in Bangladesh.

In Myanmar, Junayet taught high-school chemistry and worked part-time at his family's small pharmacy.

It has been difficult to adjust to life in the slum-like Kutupalong refugee camp, struggling for the basics for survival. But through the generosity of others, Junayet's family has found some peace.

"I am thankful for the different kinds of support and help we are receiving," says Junayet.

Part of this support is food rations of oil, lentils, sugar and salt provided in

collaboration with members of the Canadian Foodgrains Bank.

This Advent season give hope – for the future and a safe return home – for Rohingya refugees.
