Presbytery Refugee Subcommittee Report to Mission Committee September 19, 2017

On September 6, 2017, the last of the Presbytery's sponsored Syrian refugees, **Nouida Daghistani**, arrived in Canada. After staying with a good friend in Ottawa for ten days, Nouida came to Brockville, where she will be staying for at least the next twelve months. Nouida is an English/ESL teacher and very eager to be in Canada and start her new life here! She previously taught English at a girls' school in Qatar.

Volunteers are needed to help with settlement here in Brockville, as we will be assisting Nouida to find housing, set up a bank account, find a family doctor and dentist, look for a job, and settle into life here. She will be staying in temporary accommodation until she finds a permanent home. At that time, we will need to collect together furniture and household items to furnish her new residence.

With respect to the **Nahhas** family in Kemptville, Joud is back in school at Kemptville Public School. Hiba is volunteering at a local pharmacy to obtain some local work experience (and perhaps even start working as a pharmacy assistant while she works towards her recertification as a pharmacist). Tamy is starting a part-time three month contract with a local engineering firm in Kemptville. Both Tamy and Hiba are is being assisted by the CSC in Kemptville in the job search. Walid and Dalal are practicing English and learning quickly!

They have purchased a used 2008 Kia Sedona to assist them with shopping, medical appointments, and to enable Tamy and Hiba to more easily find employment. Many thanks to Rev. Samer and the congregations of St. Paul's – Kemptville, Knox – Mountain, and St. Andrew's-Knox, Spencerville for their care and support of the Nahhas family.

The Presbytery continues its fundraising efforts, so every little bit helps! "*Make a Joyful Noise*", the Presbytery fundraising concert and worship service that was held on September 17th at St. Andrew's, Lancaster, was well attended and a fun evening for all. We raised over \$1400 for the refugee fund. The Nahhas family and Nouida attended and chatted with the attendees during the reception afterwards.
