World Food Day (October 16)

Today, 800 million people worldwide go to bed with an empty stomach. The majority of the world's hungry people are subsistence farmers. These farmers struggle to cultivate plentiful harvests in the midst of a changing climate, which brings unpredictable and extreme weather events that devastate crops.

The Canadian Foodgrains Bank's Climate Fund is a way for Canadians to respond to families impacted by climate change.
